



Mentoring Program Guidelines

Guidelines for Upper Division (Mentors)

- Will be assigned a maximum of 2-3 mentees that are in lower division.
- All communication can be performed via text messaging, email, or telephone call
- It's encouraged that Mentors meet with Mentees, to establish personal relationships with them, such as a once every month coffee meeting.
- Will use the "How to be a successful College of Nursing student" brochure to assist mentees with their questions and help them get job experience and join student organizations.
- Will not share any test questions from any previous class with mentees and will abide by the CarolinaCreed.
- Encourage the mentees to join student organizations, begin job shadowing professionals, volunteer at the Free Medical Clinic and obtain job experience as a Nurse Tech.
- Encourage the mentees to see faculty members during their office hours when they're struggling with a class early in the semester rather than later.
- Send periodic text messages to see how their mentee's classes are going or to answer any questions they have and wish them good luck during finals week.

Guidelines for Lower Division (Mentees)

- Ask mentors questions about student organizations, job opportunities, job shadowing, how they can get involved in the community and how to become a successful student within the College of Nursing.
- Ask questions about the College of Nursing that you're unsure, unaware, or need clarification about.
- Will respect the mentor's time when asking questions.
- Will not ask questions about mentor's tests in a specific class from previous years and will abide by the CarolinaCreed.
- Can ask about specific classes their mentors recommend that they found useful.
- Can ask to meet the mentors once a month to build a personal friendly relationship.
- Can become a mentor within this program when accepted into the Upper Division.
